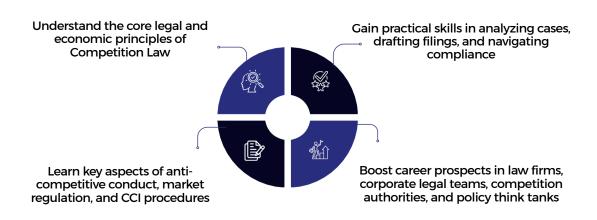
The Course

The course offers a comprehensive overview of the economic principles, legal foundations, and regulatory frameworks shaping competition law in India. Spanning five modules, it begins with the rationale for economic regulation and key schools of thought—including Harvard, Chicago, and Asian approaches—alongside the evolution from the MRTP Act to the 2002 Act and its amendments.

Participants will learn core concepts like relevant market, market power, and dominance, followed by an analysis of anti-competitive conduct—both unilateral (e.g., predatory pricing) and coordinated (e.g., cartels). The Course also Covers concepts like CCI powers, merger rules, regulator ties, and leniency tools.

Designed for students, legal professionals, and economists, the course blends theory with case studies and practitioner insights for practical competence in competition law.

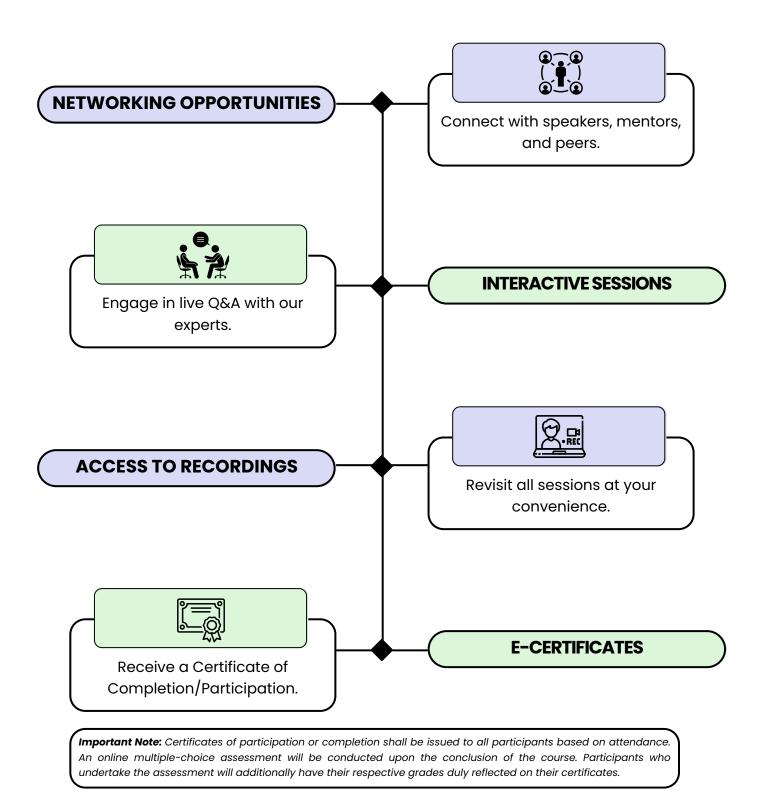

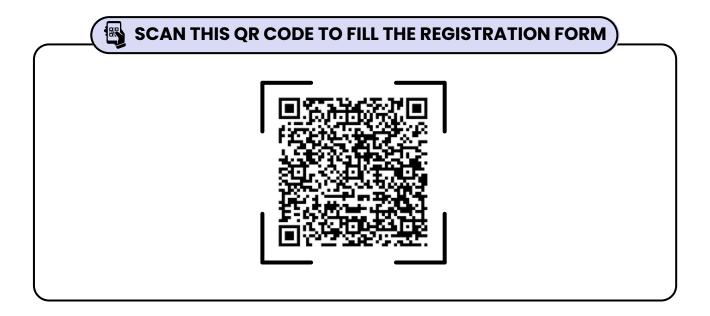
